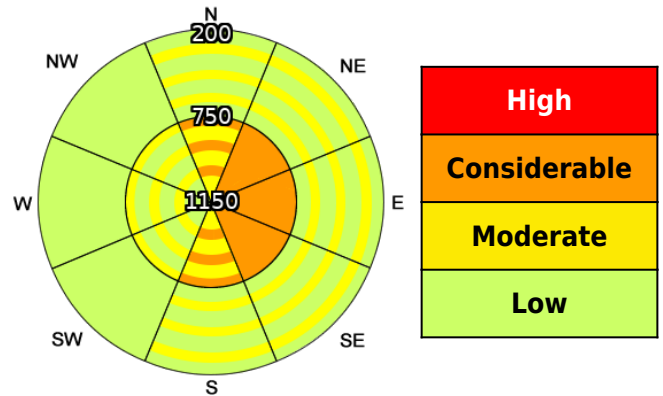

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Further accumulations of soft, poorly bonded, windslab will form on North-East to South-East aspects with some cross loading of North and South aspects, mainly above 750 metres. Greatest accumulations will be in gullies and on scarp slopes and corrie rims. Cornices will continue to build and be unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

The wind will be a fresh Westerly veering to the North-West. Intermittent showers overnight, falling as snow above 300 metres, becoming lighter through the day. The freezing level will be around 400 metres.

Comments

Observations made on Beinn a Bheithir - would expect considerably greater accumulations of windslab at Eastern end of Glen Coe.
