

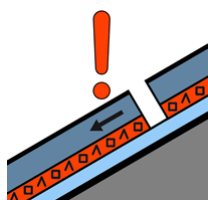

Wind Slab



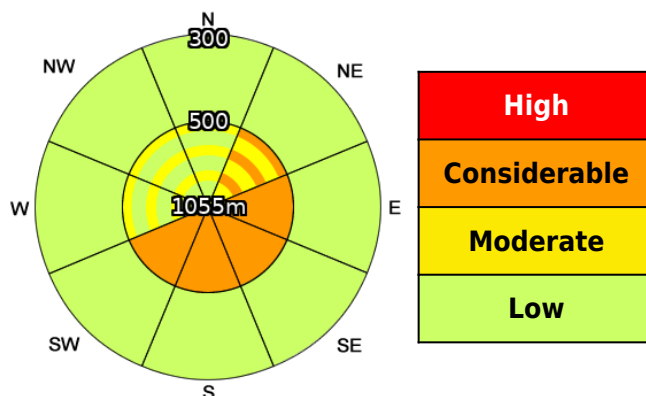
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will further accumulate predominantly on East through South to South-West aspects above 500 metres and avalanches are likely. Any sheltered locations on most other aspects will be affected by cross loading. Cornices will continue to develop. Exposed ridges will be scoured. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight there will be heavy snow showers on very strong Northerly winds. By mid morning it will become dry as the winds decrease in strength as they back towards the North-West. It will be very cold with a freezing level of around 200 metres throughout the forecast period.

Comments

Today was the most snow we have seen this winter. (Yesterday was the same)! Prospect of cold calmer conditions into next week.
