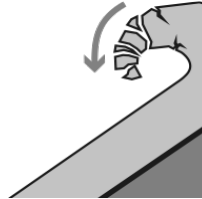

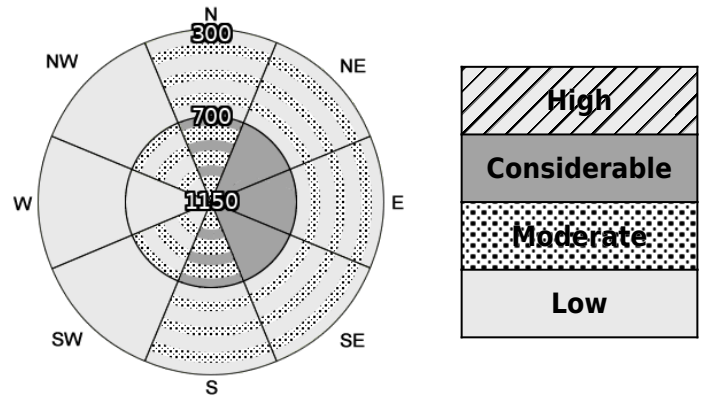

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

There will be some wind redistribution of snow onto North to East aspects forming fresh unstable windslab. Existing accumulations of poorly bonded windslab will remain on North-East through East to South aspects, mainly above 700 metres. Cornices will be unstable. There will be widespread scouring on Westerly aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

The wind will be fresh from the North-West gradually backing to the South-West and easing through the period. It will be mainly dry with the possibility of light snow showers in the afternoon. The freezing level will be around 100 metres.

**Comments**

Due to the widespread distribution of unstable windslab caused by varying wind directions, the stability of all windslab encountered should be critically assessed, particularly above 700 metres.
