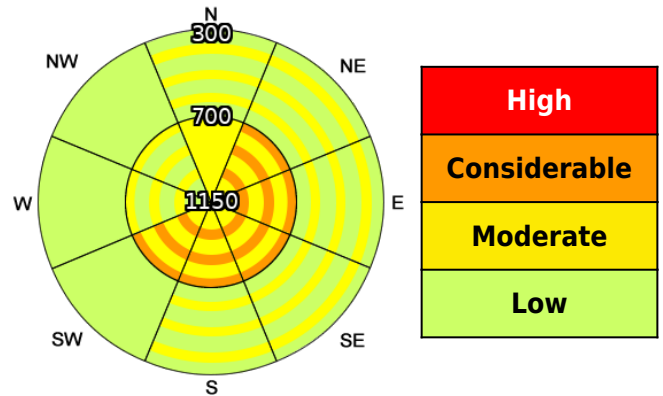

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Areas of windslab of variable stability will remain on many North-East through South-East to South-West aspects above 700 metres. There will also be some wind redistribution of snow onto these aspects forming fresh unstable windslab, mainly above this altitude. Wind exposed locations on other aspects will generally be scoured though areas of wind-eroded windslab will remain. Cornices will continue to build and be unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

A fresh North-North-East wind will moderate and back West-South-Westerly. The freezing level will be around 100 metres. It will remain dry throughout the period.

**Comments**

The sky started to clear around midday. The fresh NNE wind had picked up shortly before dawn - it was calm overnight.
