

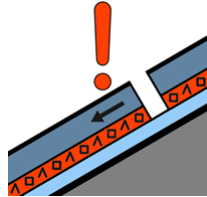

Wind Slab



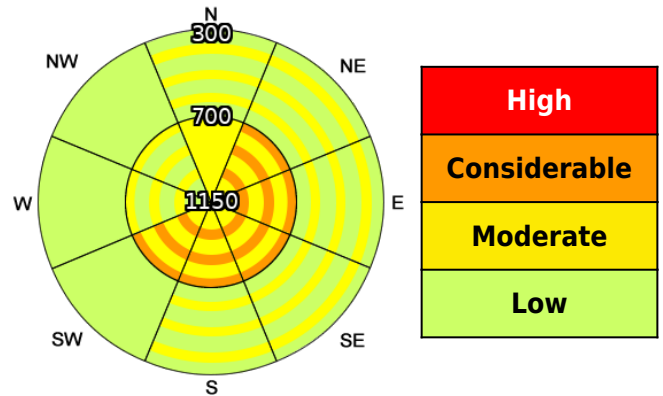
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised areas of windslab of variable stability will remain on North-East through South to South-West aspects above 700 metres, mainly in gullies, on corrie rims and the tops of summit slopes. Some fresh unstable windslab will also build on these aspects. Wind exposed locations on other aspects will generally be scoured and stable but localised unstable windslab will remain. Cornices will be unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Fresh South-West to Westerly wind overnight veering to North-East and easing. Freezing level rising to around 800 metres overnight. Becoming dry after very light overnight snow showers.

Comments

Samples of windslab in close proximity show varying stability.
