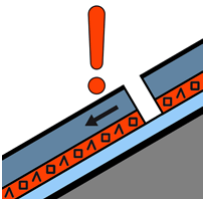


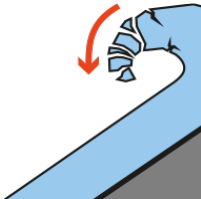

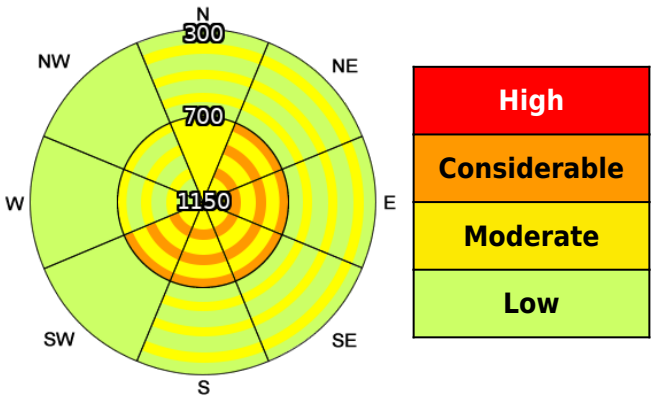
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

There will be some consolidation of the snowpack. Localised areas of poorly bonded windslab will remain on North-East through South to South-West aspects above 700 metres, particularly in the heads of steep gullies and at the tops of steep summit slopes. Other aspects are generally scoured and stable. Cornices will remain unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Moderate Easterly wind veering Westerly and easing. The freezing level will be around 500 metres after rising to 1000 metres briefly overnight. It will be mainly dry.

Comments

The rise in temperature is leading to some stabilising of the snowpack however poorly bonded layers exist at the coldest level.
