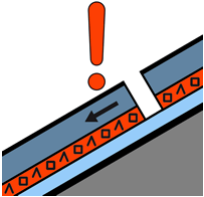

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 12/02/2015

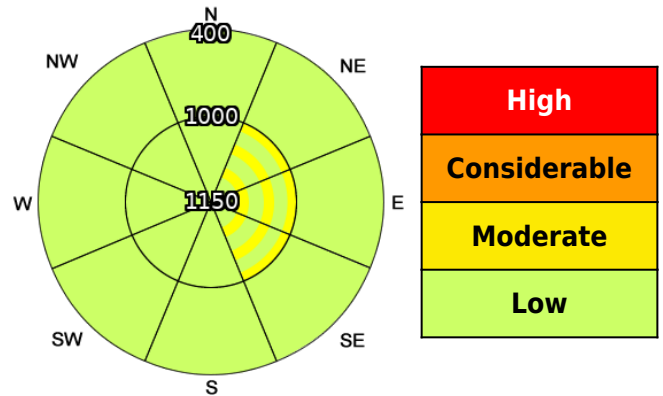
Avalanche Problems



Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Snowpack stability will remain good on all but localised areas on the very steepest slopes where older windslab underlies the surface crust. These areas are mainly confined to North-East to South-Easterly aspects above 1000 metres. New snow amounts are not expected to be significant. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight strong winds will be South-Westerly backing Southerly and moderating by morning. The freezing level will fluctuate around 1000 metres but with colder air temperature to lower levels at times. There will be a trace of new snow and the possibility of very light rain.

Comments

Colder than of late, poor visibility in low cloud. Snowpack firm and icy in many locations with long run outs.
