

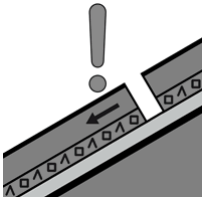

Wind Slab



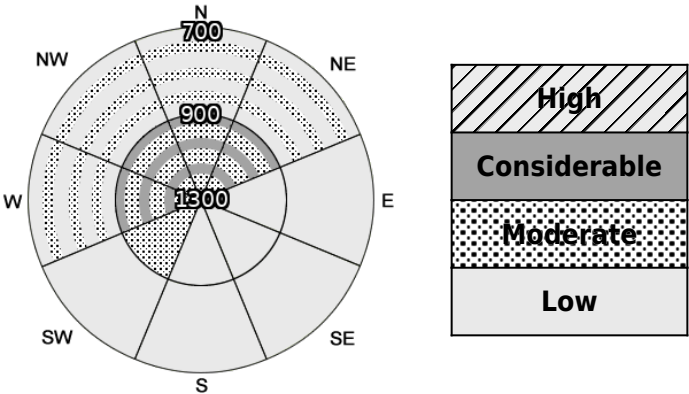

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The existing snowpack will re-freeze and will be generally stable throughout. Accumulations of unstable windslab will increasingly build through the day on mainly West through North to North-Easterly aspects above 900 metres, with more significant areas of accumulation by the afternoon. These accumulations will overly a weak layer in many places. Gully exits, scarp slopes and corrie rims most affected. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight winds will strengthen to strong Southerly backing South-Easterly during the day. Light snow showers overnight, with additional snowfall throughout the period falling to approximately 600 metres.
