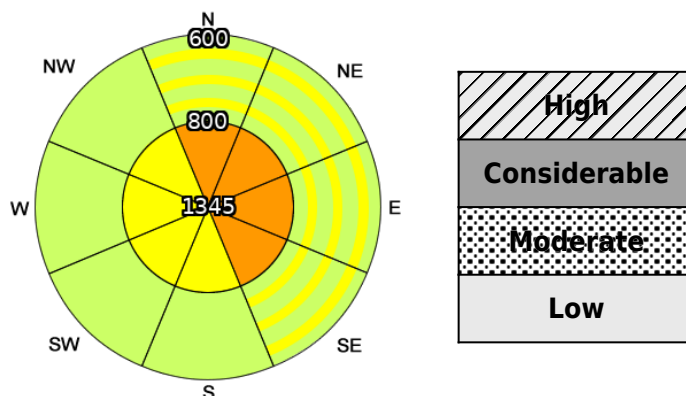
Avalanche Problems



New Snow

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will refreeze at higher levels overnight and be generally stable. Late in the day as snow showers begin new windslab will begin to develop on North-West to North-East aspects above 800 metres. These accumulations are likely to be small in extent and avoidable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Dry overnight with moderate South-Easterly winds which will veer South and increase in strength during the day with gusts to 70mph. Freezing level around 800 metres but may occasionally rise to the summits. Cloudy during the day with the occasional light snow shower towards the end of the forecast period.

Comments

A fantastic day in Torridon. Inversion early on with beautiful views over cloud filled valleys. The facets below the thin surface crust on shaded aspects should be borne in mind with the likelihood of new snow on Sunday night.
