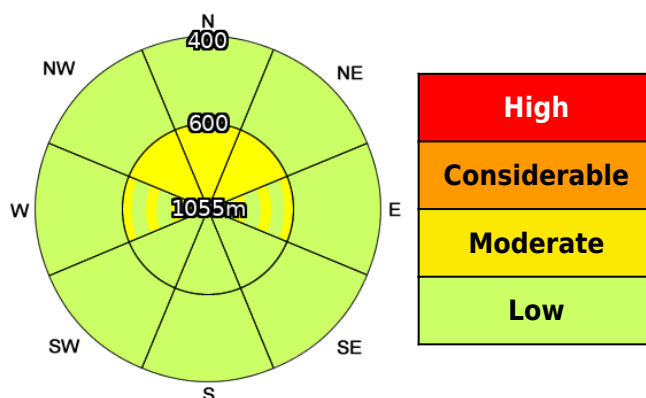

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Windslab will develop on North-West to North-East aspects above 600 metres. There will be cross loading on slopes of a Westerly and Easterly aspect where localised wind slab will form in sheltered locations. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

The freezing level will gradually drop through the period to around 500m. Overnight the strong southerly winds will be accompanied by frequent snow showers. By early morning the wind will moderate to around 20mph over summits and veer South-West accompanied by light snow showers.

Comments

The hills looked great this morning but the wind was strengthening throughout the day making progress difficult on exposed ridges and summits. Very firm snow above 600m
