

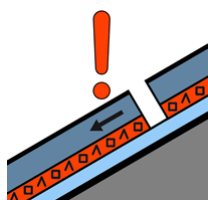

Wind Slab



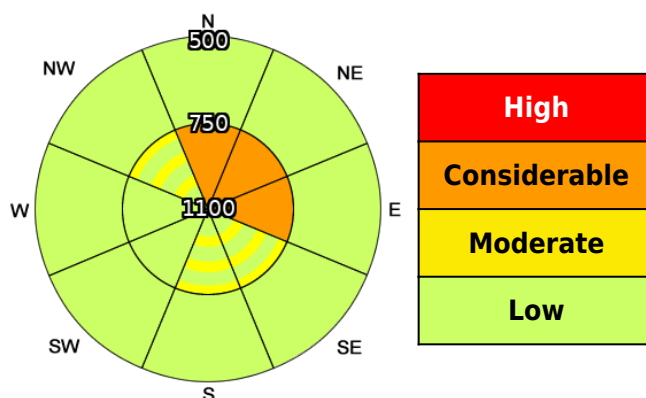
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Marginally stabilised windslab will become deeper and more widespread mainly on steep North to East aspects above 850m. New weak cornice development expected over very steep lee slopes. Better stability on windward slopes though lingering full depth avalanche potential on selected East to South aspects at around 750m. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Snow showers through the period but becoming more frequent during the day. Strong West-South-Westerly winds. Cold but with a slow rise in freezing level in daylight hours.

Comments

Wintry day above 650m though with sleet and rain at lowest elevations during the morning. Best snow cover above 600m.
