
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will be generally stable, with slopes exposed to the wind scoured and ridges generally bare. Localised accumulations of windslab will develop in very sheltered locations on primarily East to South aspects above 750m, then North-West to North-Easterly aspects. Greatest accumulations will be in gully exits and corrie rims. Cornices will also build on these aspects. Cross loading will affect South-West aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Snow showers will gradually die out and winds will ease and turn Northerly. By early morning the wind will have veered to the South-East and quickly increase in strength. The freezing level will rise gradually during the day to around 600m and snow showers will become more frequent.

Comments

A bit more snow in the last couple of days making the glen look very wintry. A brief respite today before the next weather system arrives.
