

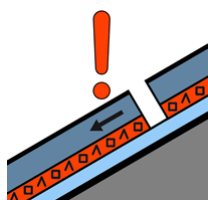

Wind Slab



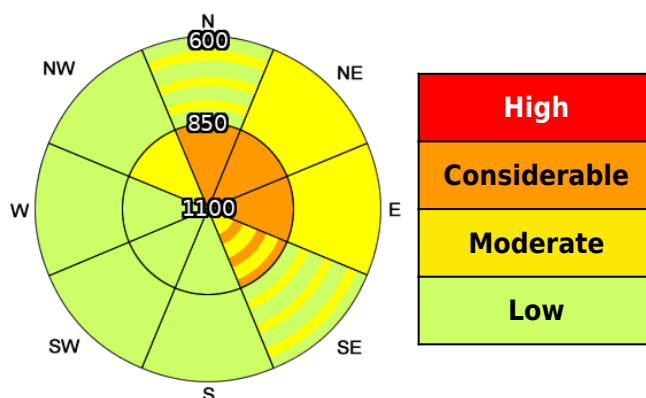
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Stability will remain poor on steepest North to East aspects above 850m. Further accumulations of weakly bonded windslab will develop later in the day primarily on steep, sheltered North-West through North to North-Easterly aspects, where avalanches are likely. Good stability on ridges and recently wind-exposed slopes and gullies. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Dry overnight with easing winds, before the arrival of a new frontal system later in the day bringing further snow showers above 600m. This will be accompanied by strengthening South-East, South, then South Westerly winds.

Comments

Cold and clear with ice developing, many buttress areas under fresh cover.
