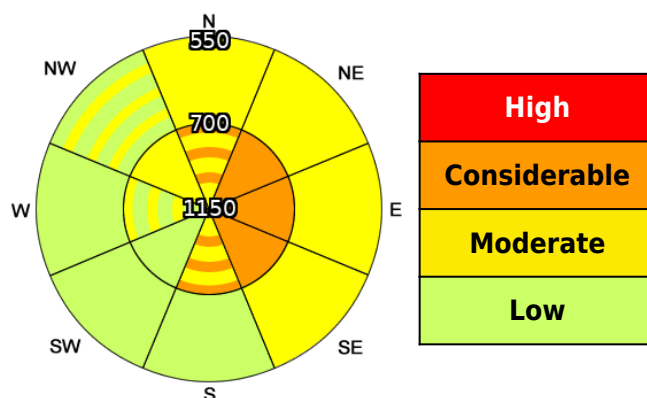

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will continue to develop in sheltered areas mainly on North-East to South-East aspects above 700 metres with North and South aspects also affected by cross-loaded deposits. Greatest hazard will be found on steep terrain such as gully exits and scarp slopes where avalanches are likely. Exposed aspects remain scoured and icy. Newly formed cornices will require care. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

There will be further snow showers, easing throughout the day. The freezing level will be around 600 metres, dropping slightly later in the afternoon. Gale force winds, veering throughout the night, will be from the West-North-West.

Comments

Deep fresh drifts from valley level. Good route selection required.
