

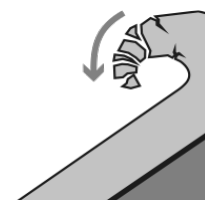

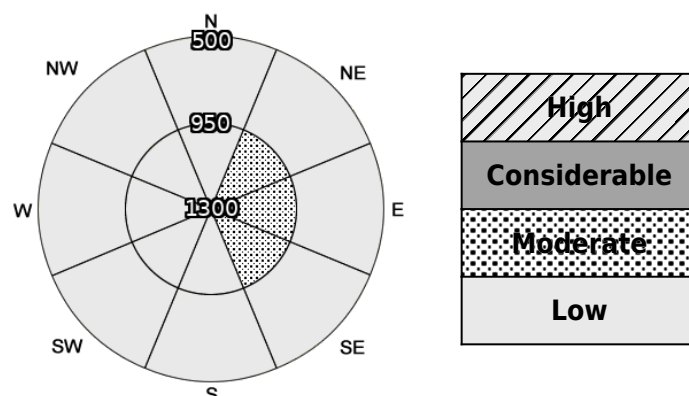

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will moisten overnight, stabilities will be present on mainly North-East to South-East aspects above 950 metres with steep and convex terrain most affected. During the day stability will improve, and the snowpack will gradually refreeze, some localised thin windslab will form around gully tops and corrie rims but will not be extensive. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Freezing level will remain above the summits overnight, lowering to 450 metres during the day. Light precipitation overnight falling as rain to all levels, turning to light snow showers during the day. Winds strong West-South-Westerly.

Comments

A brief warm spell overnight before returning colder once more and a re-freezing of the snowpack.
