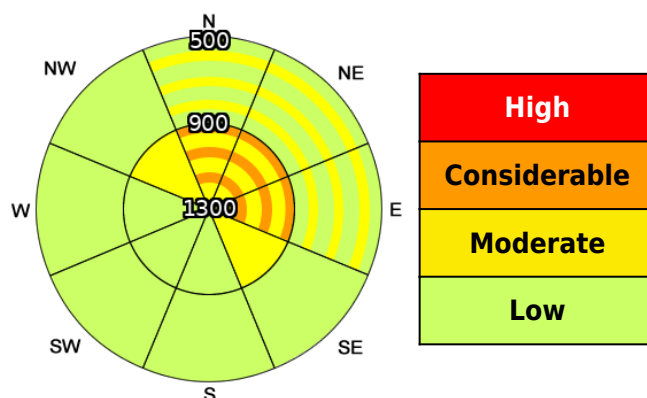

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will continue to develop on mainly Northerly to Easterly aspects above 900 metres. Instabilities will mostly be in areas of steep and convex terrain, gully tops and corrie rims. More localised windslab will lie on North-West and South-East aspects due to cross loading. Cornices will be unstable. Elsewhere will be generally well bonded and stable or scoured and bare. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Snow showers are expected throughout the forecast period on strong South to South-Westerly winds. The freezing level will rise to above the summits for a few hours overnight before falling again to 900 metres.

Comments

Snowpack very firm on wind exposed slopes with serious run out potential.
