

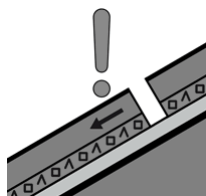

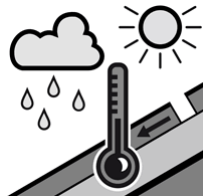

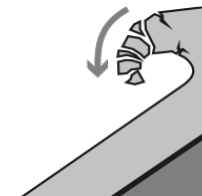
Wind Slab

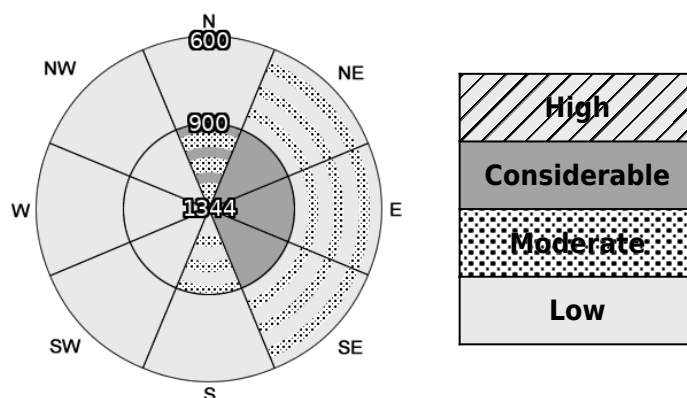

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

There will be a brief period of high instability overnight as the freezing level rises above the summits. Early on Sunday, the existing snowpack will start to consolidate and stabilise. Fresh areas of unstable windslab will form in sheltered locations. Greatest accumulations will be on sheltered North-East, East and South-East aspects above 900m. Localised areas of unstable snow will also be present in other sheltered locations. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

The freezing level will rise above the summits overnight before dropping to around 600m early on Sunday. Heavy snow then rain turning to snow showers on Sunday. Strong, generally Westerly winds
