

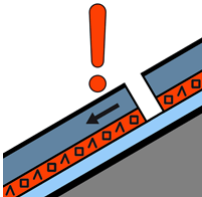

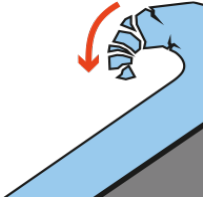

Wind Slab



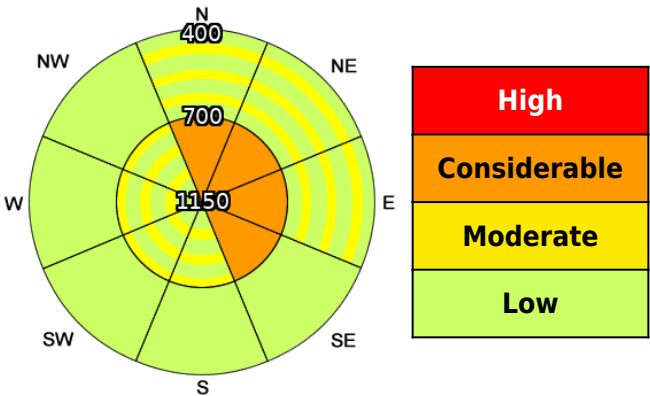
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will continue to form in many sheltered gullies and on slopes with a North through East to South-Easterly aspect mainly above 700 metres, cross loading due to localised wind conditions may well affect other aspects. Avalanches are likely in these areas. Large cornices will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

It will remain cold with frequent and heavy snow showers overnight and through the course of the day. Winds will be generally from the South West strengthening to gale force. The freezing level will be around 400 metres.
