

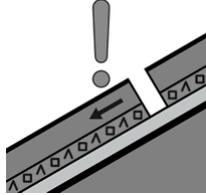


Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab




Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Weakly stabilised windslab will continue to be loaded on to all steep North-East to South-East aspects above 700m where avalanches will occur. Cross-loading expected on North and South aspects as well as a few selected North-West facing gullies. Recently formed cornices over lee slopes may be large and prone to spontaneous collapse. Wind exposed aspects and ridge lines generally stable. The avalanche hazard will be High



Forecast Weather Influences

Snow showers persisting overnight but tapering out by noon. Strong to moderate generally Westerly winds, easing a little later. Remaining cold but temperatures easing a little.

Comments

Very wintry. 20cm of undrifted snow at 300m. Very deep drifts at higher altitudes. Hard going breaking trail on skis on Tuesday. Wind exposed aspects and ridge lines will offer better safe travel options.
