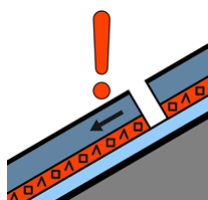
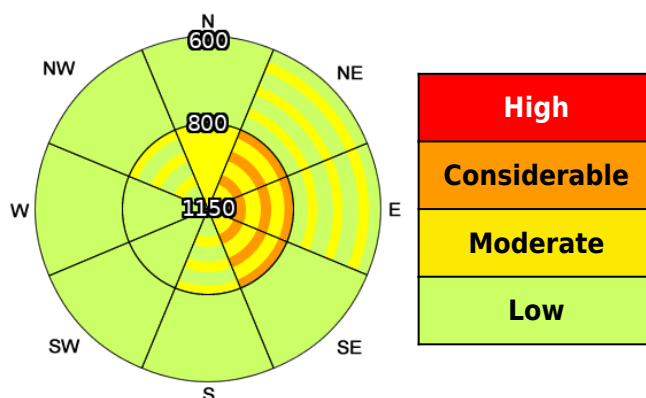


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE CONSIDERABLE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Friday 06/03/2015****Avalanche Problems****Persistent Weak Layers****Wet Snow****Cornices****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

The snowpack will be soft but generally well bonded with some wet snow instabilities remaining on steep terrain mostly on North through East to South-East aspects above 800 metres. Particularly affected will be gully exits, corrie rims and convex slopes on North-East to South-East aspects, many of which have unstable cornices above them. Westerly aspects and exposed ridges will be largely snow free and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

There will be some snow around the summits before rain at all levels later in the afternoon. Overnight the winds will back from the West to the South before veering South-Westerly and increasing to storm force during the day.

Comments

Likely to be a very windy day on the hill. Cornice collapse is likely to be a significant hazard.
