

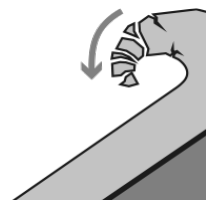
### THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE

##### Avalanche Problems



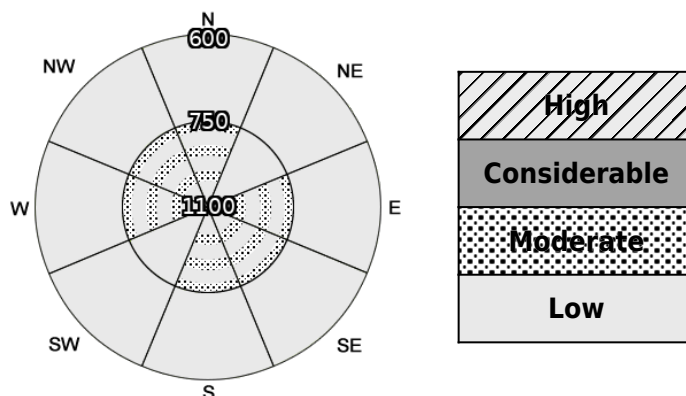
Wind Slab

##### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Colder temperatures will refreeze the snowpack and bring improved stability in many locations above 750m. Some residual hazard from full depth avalanches will persist on selected East to South aspects at around 750m. A little thin new windslab is possible on West to North aspects although this is expected to be very localised. Any remaining cornices may be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



##### Forecast Weather Influences

Westerly winds veering South and moderating. Then becoming South-Easterly by early morning and gradually strengthening to gale force accompanied by light showers. The freezing level will fluctuate during the day. Initially at 300m it will rise to above the summits by early afternoon then drop to around 700m by evening.

##### Comments

Considerable snow loss from below 600m. However there is still significant amount of snow above 700m. Travel on foot is now much easier with a few parties heading into Coire Ardair today.
