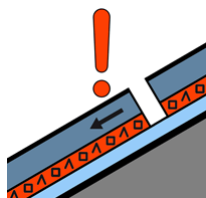
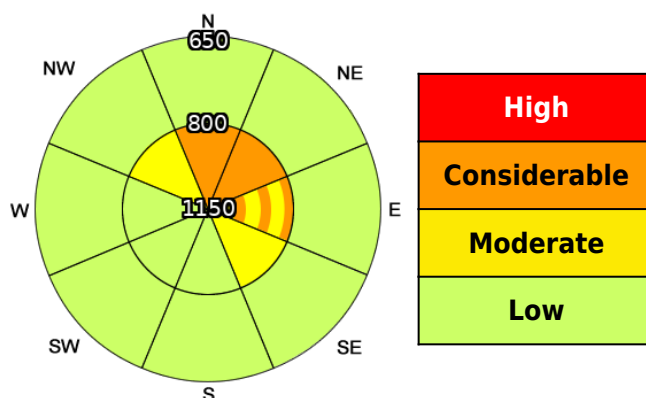


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE CONSIDERABLE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Wednesday 11/03/2015****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Persistent Weak Layers****Cornices****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

New poorly bonded windslab will develop with the arrival of snow showers. Greatest accumulations will be found on some North-West aspects but mainly North and North-East aspects above 800 metres. East and South-East aspects will also be affected by cross-loading. Exposed aspects and features will be scoured and stable. Unstable new cornices will start to reform. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

A dry start but with heavier snowfall to around 800 metres in the afternoon. Winds will initially be from the South-South-East veering to the South-South-West and increasing to gale force.

Comments

Patchy snow cover, greatest amounts on North-East and East aspects, very icy on plateau areas.
