

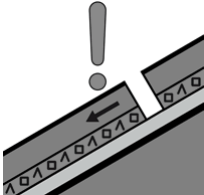

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 19/03/2015

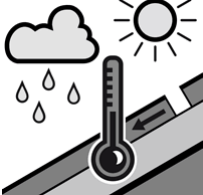
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab



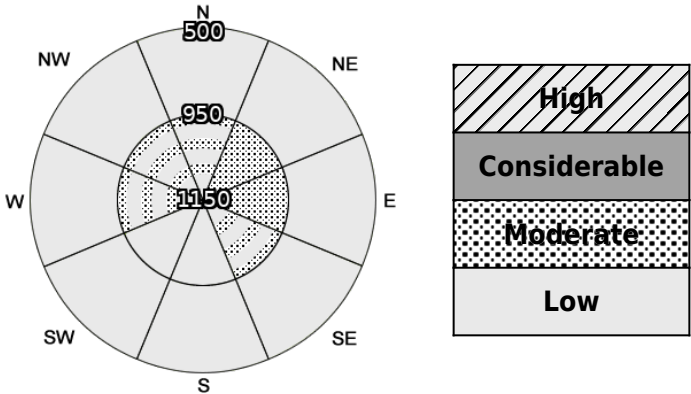
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised areas of new moderately bonded windslab will start to develop in the afternoon, mainly on North to East aspects above 950 metres, these are not expected to be significant, mainly a dusting in most places but may form deeper accumulations around corrie rims and gully exits. Elsewhere the snowpack will slowly soften but remain generally well bonded. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

It should remain dry until the latter part of the afternoon then light showers falling as snow above 1000 metres. The light South-South- Westerly winds will veer to South-Westerly and increase becoming strong by mid afternoon. The freezing level will be around 1100 metres but with some cooler overnight temperatures.

Comments

Some changeable conditions with light to moderate precipitation falling as snow above 1000 metres at first are expected over the next few days.
