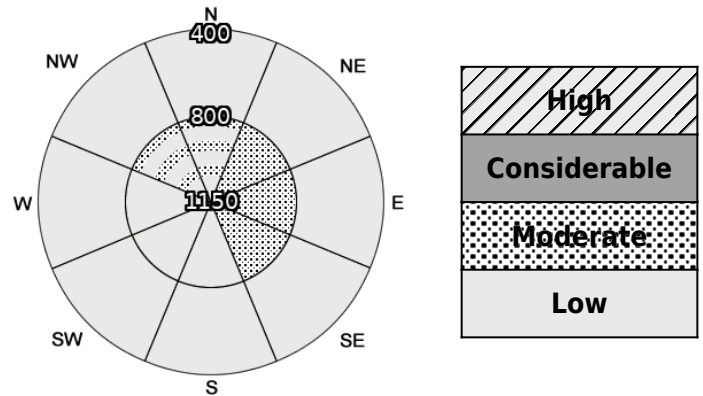

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New areas of weekly bonded windslab will develop mainly on North through East to South-East aspects, the greatest accumulations will be in sheltered gullies, on corrie rims and the tops of summit slopes above 800 metres. Wind exposed locations on other aspects will generally be scoured and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight, the freezing level will lower to around 400 metres, staying cold through the day. Precipitation falling as snow showers above 300 metres through most of the period. At first the winds will be strong Westerly then variable, becoming North-Westerly.

Comments

Snow showers becoming less frequent in the afternoon.
