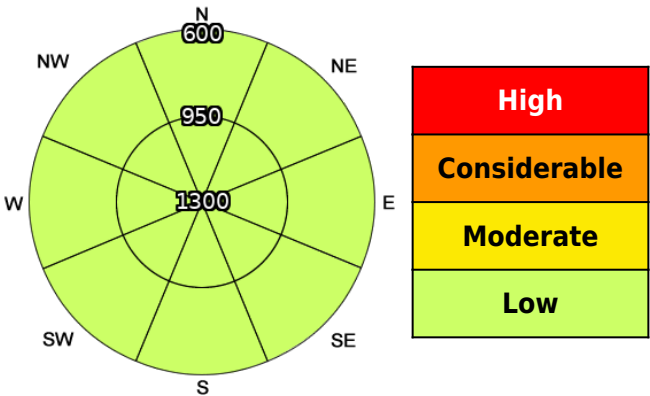
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The old snowpack will remain well bonded and stable. New accumulations of redistributed snow will form moderately bonded windslab in localised wind sheltered locations on mainly North-West to North-Easterly aspects above 900 metres with corrie rims and gully exits most affected. A light snow covering will lie on other aspects but accumulations will not be significant. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Snow showers sometimes persistent will continue into the evening, dying out in the early hours with a dry day to follow. Winds will be light North-North-Westerly overnight then veering and strengthening South-South-Easterly in the day. Freezing level will be around 600 metres.

Comments

Cooler temperatures and a wintry prospect, with firm snow and serious run outs.
