

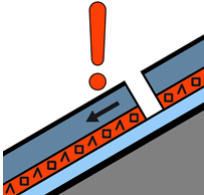

Avalanche Problems



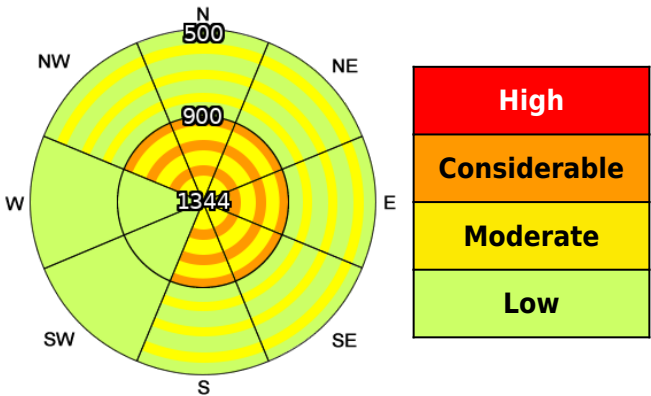
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Fresh areas of unstable windslab will form in areas sheltered from the wind, initially, greatest deposits will be on steep North-West, North and North-East aspects. During the day, redistributed snow will build additional unstable windslab onto North-East, East and South aspects mainly above 900 metres. Exposed old snow will be frozen and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

A band of precipitation will cross the area during the day, falling as snow above 600m. Winds will be Southerly overnight veering strong North-Westerly in the morning.

Comments

Unstable snow will become redistributed during the day.
