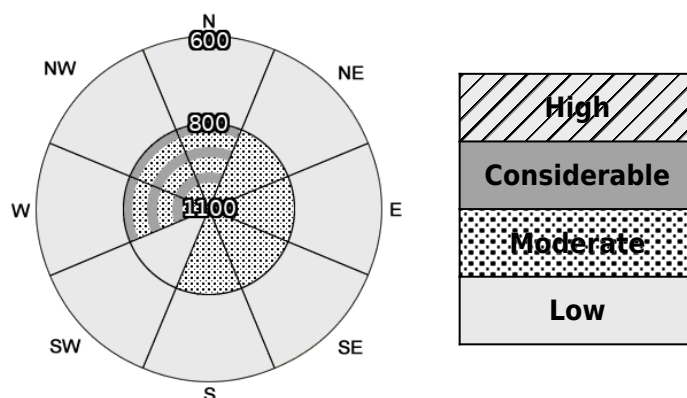
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Some new unstable windslab will develop on steep and wind sheltered North-West through North to East and South-Easterly aspects above 800m with some cross-loading in other wind sheltered locations. The old exposed snowpack will remain well stabilised in most locations. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Further snow showers overnight will mostly die out as the day progresses. Winds will be strong South Easterly, easing West for a period before increasing again North-Westerly mid morning. Temperatures will stay cool with Freezing levels around 600m.

Comments

Only really a dusting of fresh, although more snow showers expected overnight. Cover remains generally good on the high lee slopes, very patchy below 800m on all windward aspects.
