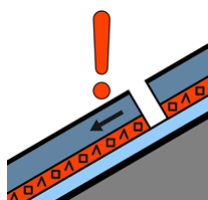

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Saturday 28/03/2015

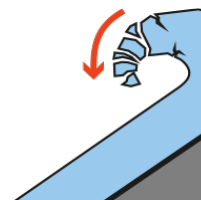

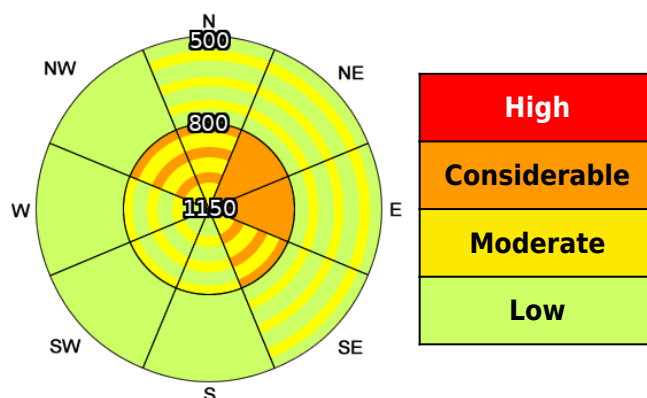

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Deposits of unstable windslab will be present on North-West through North-East to South-East aspects, mainly above 800 metres. Wet snow instabilities are expected on these aspects during the period of thaw. Cornices will continue to build and be liable to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Fresh South-Westerly wind backing Southerly and becoming gale force overnight before veering Westerly and easing slightly through day. Overnight sleet/snow showers mainly above 800 metres will turn to rain at all levels at dawn. Snow showers return in the afternoon above 700 metres. The freezing level will be around 800 metres, peaking for a spell above the summits in the morning.

Comments

Debris observed on North-Easterly aspects probably due to cornice collapse and snow sluffing off crags.
