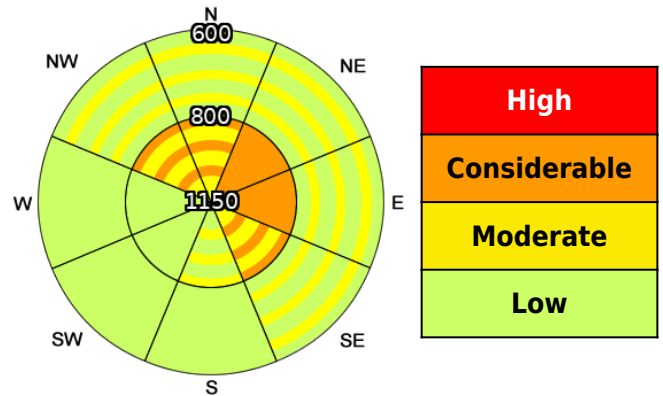

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Further deposits of unstable windslab will form, on Northerly to Easterly aspects mainly above 800 metres. Locations most affected will be gullies, corrie rims and summit slopes. Cornices will continue to build and be unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

The wind will be strong Westerly and reduce progressively through the period, backing during the day to South-West then Southerly. There will be light snow showers overnight becoming slightly heavier through the day. The freezing level will be around 500 metres, falling lower overnight.

**Comments**

Lighter winds than of late allowed snow showers with enormous snowflakes. The showers fell as snow to surprisingly low levels given the freezing level.
