

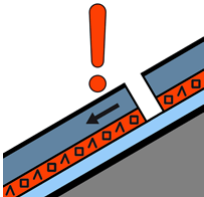

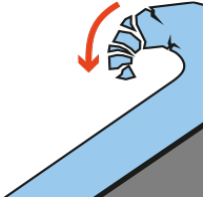

Wind Slab



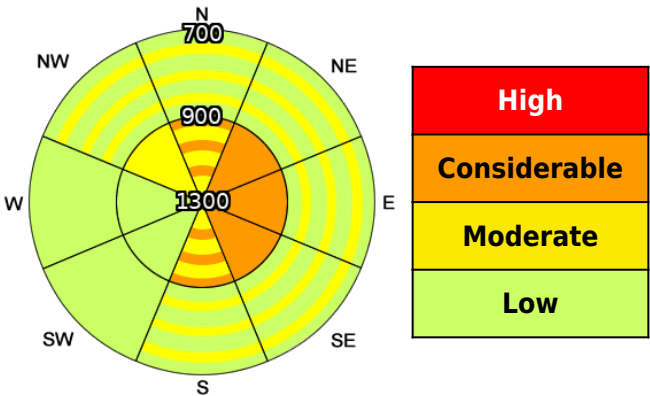
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Weakly bonded windslab will become more widespread affecting many aspects in the changeable wind direction. Avalanches are likely on steep North-East to South-Easterly aspects above 900 metres. Windslab will also develop on Northerly and Southerly aspects due to cross loading. Cornices will be unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Snowfall is expected throughout the forecast period. Strong to gale force Southerly winds will veer to the North-West overnight, then back to the West during the day. Freezing level rising to 900 metres briefly overnight before falling to 500 metres.
