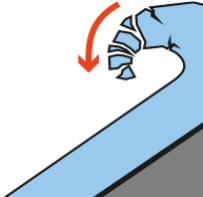

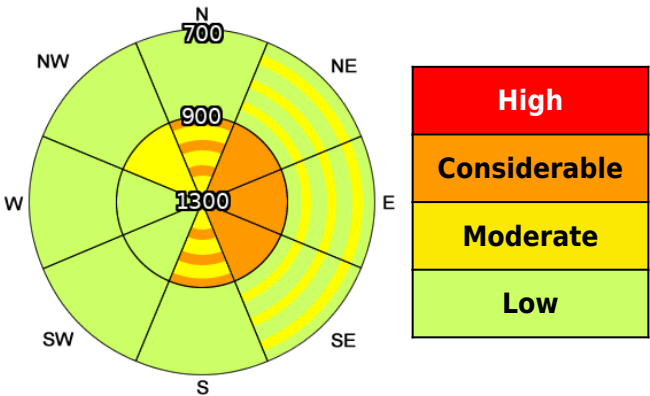

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will gradually improve in stability in most places but weaknesses will remain in the deeper accumulations which are present in wind sheltered locations on mainly North-East to South-Easterly facing slopes above 900 metres, with steep and convex shaped terrain most affected. Northerly and Southerly aspects will also be affected due to cross loading of localised windslab deposits. Cornices above Easterly aspects are large and unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Winds will be moderate strength South-South-Easterly overnight before veering and lessening in strength South-South-Westerly in the afternoon. Some light snow showers are expected above 800 metres throughout the period. Freezing level around 1000 metres.
