



**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Instabilities in the recently deposited windslab, primarily on North East to South East aspects above 700 metres and in other sheltered locations will persist. The tops of gullies, corrie rims and convex rolls will be most affected, here as the freezing level rises during the day avalanches are likely. Cornices will be liable to collapse. Many exposed ridges scoured. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

Fresh South-East winds initially, will moderate becoming Easterly by dawn. There will be light showers falling as snow above 600 metres later in the night. The freezing level will be around 600 metres at first, rising to above the summits later in the day as showers turn to rain at all levels and the wind veers through South to West increasing in strength.

**Comments**

A lot of snow on Easterly aspects. Balmy 10 degrees at road level but below freezing on the summits. Winter is still here.
