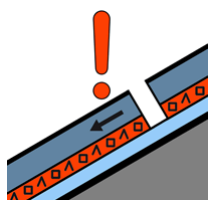


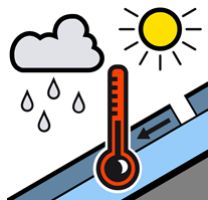

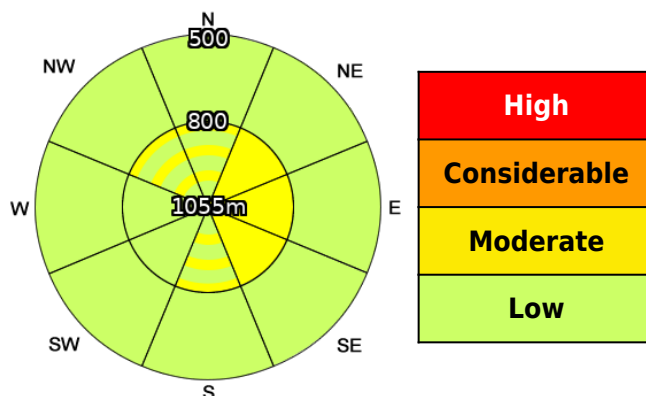

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Existing windslab will persist on North-East to South-East aspects above 750 metres with the tops of gullies and corrie rims most affected. The snowpack will be moist at all levels but continue to generally stabilise. In isolated locations, steep convex terrain wet snow instabilities will be present. Cornices will be weak and prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

The evening will be dry with moderate Westerly winds and the freezing level around the summits. Overnight the winds will back to the South West as the freezing level rises to 2000 metres and light showers of snow turn to rain at all levels during the day.

Comments

A day of low cloud in Torridon. Mild in the valley with a full 10 degrees of temperature difference between sea level and the summits.
