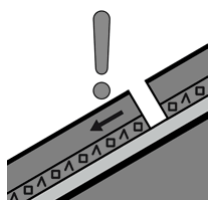


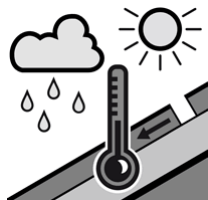

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 06/04/2015

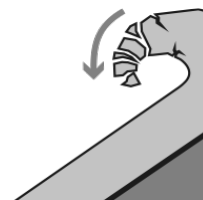

Persistent Weak Layers



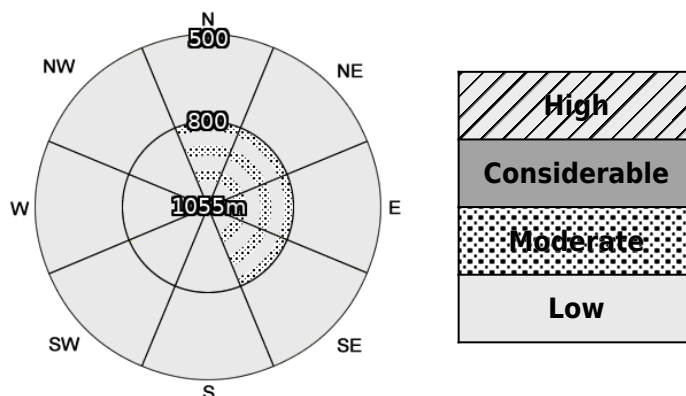

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The remaining snowpack will continue to consolidate and gently thaw. Localised instabilities will persist on steep terrain, primarily on North-East to South-East aspects above 800 metres. Cornices will soften further and be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

It will remain mild with the freezing level well above the summits. Winds will be South-Westerly throughout the forecast period, initially light but with gusts up to 40 mph during the day. Predominantly dry with a little drizzle during the day.

Comments

A very busy day in Torridon. Hill goers footwear varied from winter boots to trainers. Alpine like conditions with large areas of bare rock on the ridges interspersed by snowy aretes. Snow remains firm underfoot on shaded aspects.
