

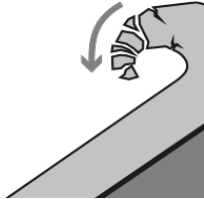

**Avalanche Problems**



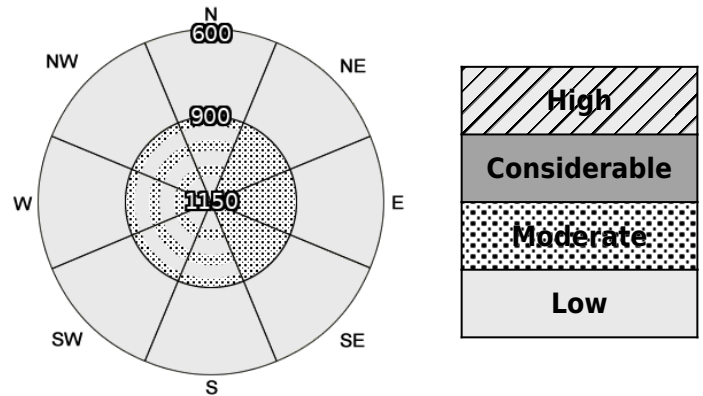
Wet Snow

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Little change is expected to the snowpack it will remain moist and mostly stable. Some instabilities will persist where accumulations are deepest mainly on North-East to South-Easterly aspects above 900 metres. Wet snow surface instabilities will also exist on steeper slopes and cornices prone to collapse affecting slopes below. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



**Forecast Weather Influences**

It will remain dry and mild with the freezing level above the summits. Winds will be light Westerly backing to West-South-West and increasing in strength.

**Comments**

Mild, settled conditions look likely to continue. As the thaw continues, there is an increasing hazard from cornice collapse and falling rocks both could affect the slopes below.
