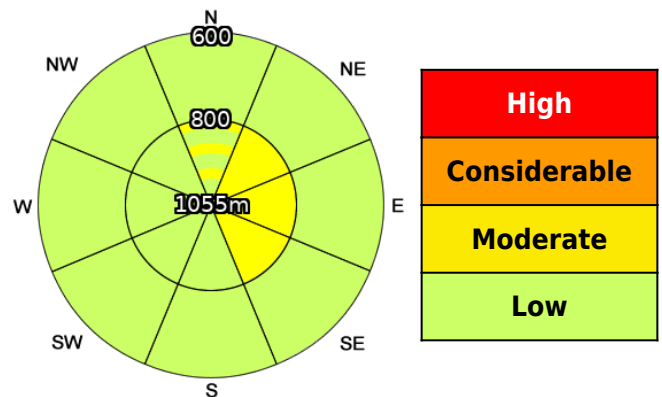
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable localised windslab will continue to build on wind sheltered lee aspects on mainly North-East to South-East slopes above 800 metres with ridge crest fringes, corrie rims and gully exits in higher locations most affected. Elsewhere snow cover will be thin and on bare ground, here stability will be good. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Light snow showers will continue throughout the forecast period. Winds will continue strong South-Westerly veering and lessening in strength West-North-Westerly in the afternoon. Freezing levels at 400 metres overnight will rise to 800 metres by the end of the day.

Comments

A wintry scene today with strong South- Westerly winds, this will continue until monday when freezing levels will rise well above summit levels.
