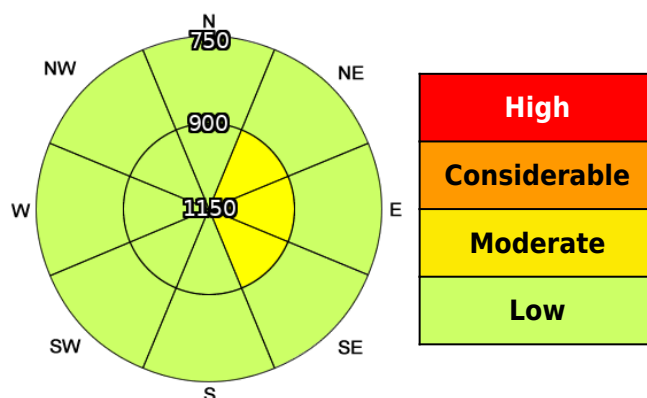


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Sunday 12/04/2015****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

New deep moderately bonded windslab will form over older accumulations on North-East to South-East aspects above 900 metres. Particularly affected will be sheltered steep terrain such as gully exits and scarp slopes. Elsewhere there may be a light covering of snow but mostly it will be patchy with exposed locations snow free. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

There will be further snow showers down to around 600 metres. Heaviest throughout the night but easing during the day. It will be a windy day, initially from the South-West but veering to the West-North-West by the end of the day.
