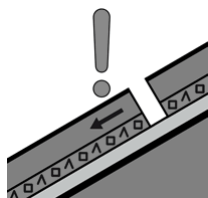
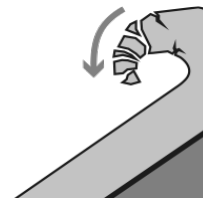
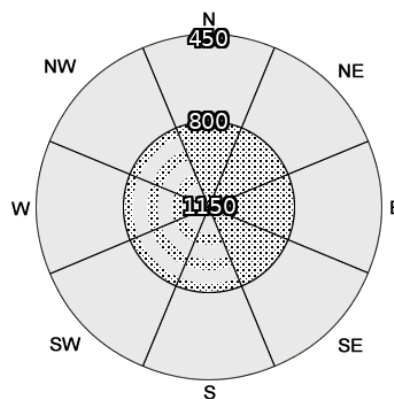


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 13/04/2015****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Persistent Weak Layers****Cornices****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

At first, moderately bonded windslab will continue to form in sheltered areas, mainly on North-East to South-East aspects above 800 metres. Cross loading will affect other aspects particularly sheltered gullies and scarp slopes. As milder conditions and rain affects the snowpack, wet snow instabilities will develop, mainly on steep North through East to South-East aspects. Cornices will be unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Freezing at all levels this evening with some light snow showers, winds will be strong from the West-North-West backing to the South. A dry morning then precipitation falling briefly as snow then rain, with strengthening Southerly winds.

Heavy rain is forecast for Monday evening and through Tuesday till Wednesday afternoon.
