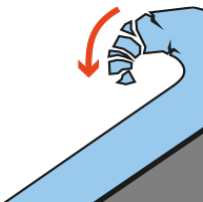

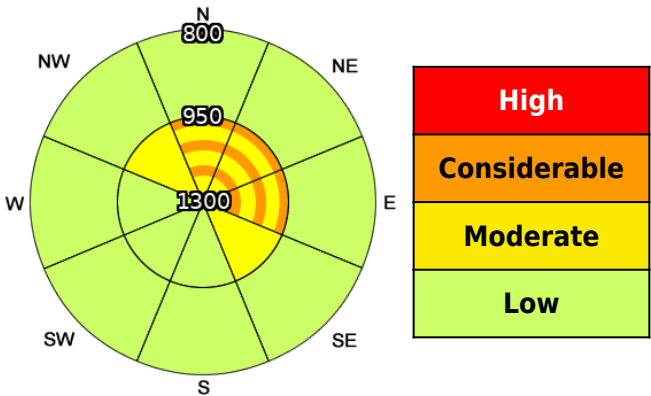

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable localised deposits of windslab will be present mainly above 950 metres on North-West, North, North-East to South-Easterly aspects with wind sheltered corrie rims, gully exits and steep and convex shaped terrain most affected, especially as temperatures rise. Cornices above these aspects will also be liable to collapse. Elsewhere the terrain will be bare of snow. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Winds Westerly overnight with some snowfall above 400 metres. During the day winds will back and become strong Southerly. Precipitation falling as snow at first will gradually turn to sleet on the tops as freezing levels rise well above the summits.
