

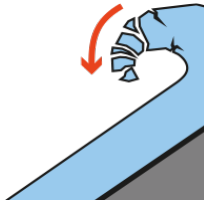

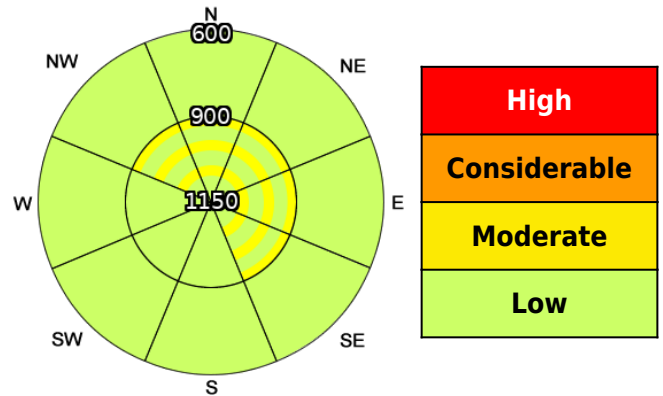

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

At first wet snow instabilities will remain on all aspects until the freezing level lowers and cold conditions affect the snowpack. Then, above 600 metres on all aspects the snowpack will consolidate, start to stabilise and re-freeze. New snow amounts are not expected to be significant but localised accumulations of shallow windslab will develop on North-East to South-East aspects mainly above 800 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Rain will continue at all elevations through the night, with the freezing level at around 1800 metres, along with very strong South-Westerly winds. During the early part of the day the freezing level will lower to around 700 metres, winds will ease and become West-North-West. There will be light snow fall above 500 metres but predominately a dry day.
