



Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

A residual wet snow instability will persist initially overnight on North-East to South-East aspects above 900m, here also, weak, large cornices will impose a high additional load in the event of collapse. Stability will improve as day breaks with the return of cooler conditions. Some new localised pockets of fresh windslab are possible cross-loading onto steepest gully flanks above 850m on North East through to South Easterly aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Rain initially although becoming progressively cooler overnight as a strong showery West to North Westerly airflow brings snow down to around 400 or 500m.

Comments

Accumulations of any new snow expected to be fairly modest with the approach and passing of cold front.
