Wet Snow

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Falling temperatures overnight will lead to some further consolidation of the moist snowpack. Above 900 metres, snow showers will lead to some localised deposits of fresh unstable snow mainly on North-West to North-East aspects. New deposits are not expected to be significant. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

The wind will be strong to gale force from a South-South-Westerly direction. Precipitation falling as light rain overnight, will turn to snow showers at higher levels with more persistent rain at lower levels. The freezing level will fall gradually through the period to around summit levels.

Comments

Gradually falling freezing level with more fresh snow expected over Sunday night down to 800 metres.
