

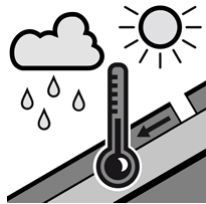

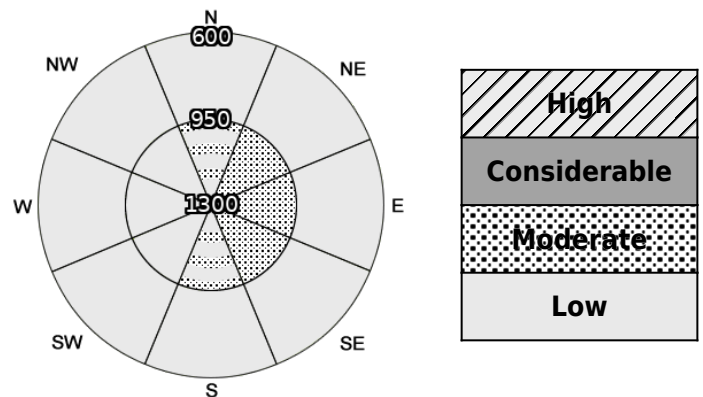
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

With the onset of rain recent windslab accumulations will become more unstable in areas of steep terrain. Localised areas on Northerly to Easterly aspects above 1000 metres will be most affected especially around corrie rims, gully tops and scarp slopes. After the thaw localised windslab will begin to develop again on these aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

The freezing level will rise to well above the summits overnight. Light snow showers turning to rain for a time during the morning. Freezing level then lowering to 1000 metres around midday as rain turns to snow showers above 900 metres. Gale force winds continuing South to South-Westerly.
