



Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 24/12/2015

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

There is very little snow in the mountains. Much of the cosmetic dusting will melt overnight leaving isolated patches on North East facing slopes above 900 metres. By morning any remaining snow will become firm as temperatures drop. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Very strong Southerly winds overnight will veer South Westerly by morning. Wet snow initially will turn to rain at all levels as the freezing level rises above the summits by midnight. Drier during the day with the odd light snow shower as the freezing level rapidly falls to 400 metres.

Comments

Still very little snow but hills looking more wintery with patches of ice visible above 900 metres.
