

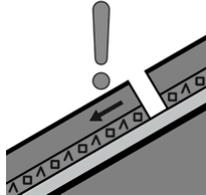

Avalanche Problems




Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

General snow cover is expected to remain fairly thin but localised areas of moderate to weakly bonded windslab will exist in sheltered locations such as summit gully exits and steep scarp slopes mainly above 850 metres. Greatest accumulations will be on North-West through North to Easterly aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Snow showers above 500 metres heavy at times will continue to affect the area for much of the period. Winds will be strong West-South-West overnight decreasing through the course of the morning and backing Easterly later. The freezing level will be around 650 meters.
