
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will accumulate overnight on North to East aspects above 800 metres and in other sheltered locations. The tops of gullies and corrie rims will be particularly affected. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Very strong South Westerly winds overnight will decrease in strength by morning before backing South Easterly, later Easterly by the end of the day. Snow showers overnight and during the morning will clear to leave a dry afternoon. The freezing level will be around 600 metres throughout the forecast period.

Comments

The heavy snow of Thursday morning has transformed the appearance of the mountains. Much of the cover remains thin but forecast strong South Westerly winds will redistribute snow onto sheltered North East aspects overnight.
