

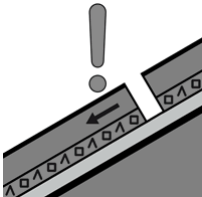

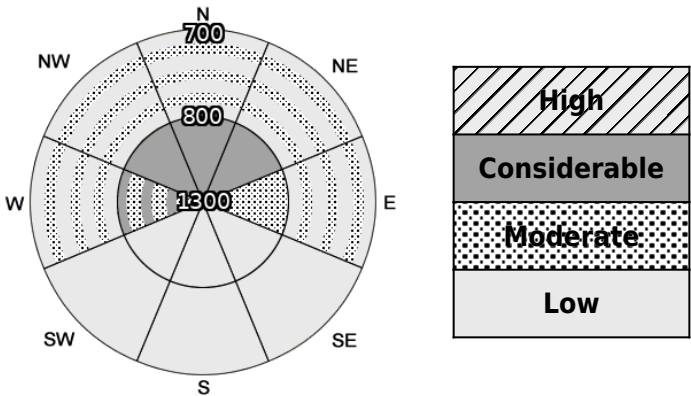
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable areas of localised deep windslab will continue to develop on mainly Westerly through North to North - Easterly aspects above 800 metres with steep convex terrain, gully exits, coire rims and back walls most affected. Many other aspects and wind sheltered places will be affected with unstable accumulations due to cross loading. Wind scoured ridges and plateau areas remain bare of snow. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight, snowfall and drifting will continue above 800 metres, dying out before dawn to leave a dry day. Winds will be strong East-South-Easterly overnight backing to moderate strength Westerly then Southerly at the end of the day. Freezing levels around 800 metres most of the day before rising above summit levels later.

Comments

Winter conditions today with significant drifting - poor visibility. A calmer day Sunday freezing levels rising later.
