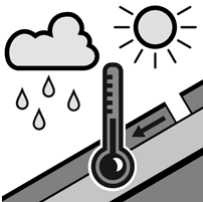


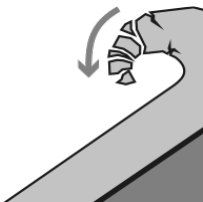

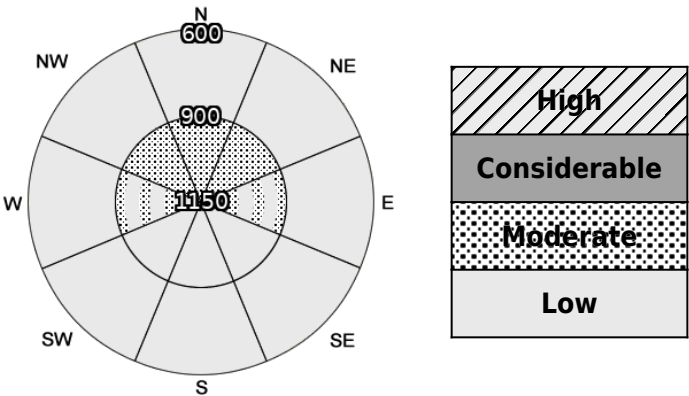
Wet Snow

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will continue to slowly thaw through most of the period leading to wet snow instabilities on steeper slopes. The greatest hazard will be on North-West to North-East aspects mainly above 900 metres. Cornices will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight, rain at all altitudes with only a dusting of sleet-snow over the highest summits. Dry for much of the day and the freezing level will lower to around summit level. The variable Southerly winds will be strong at first, decreasing for a period then increasing to gale force.

Comments

A changeable weather forecast with the freezing level fluctuating the Southerly winds will be very strong over the summits.
