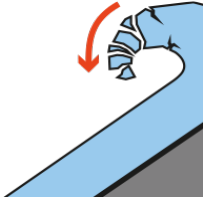

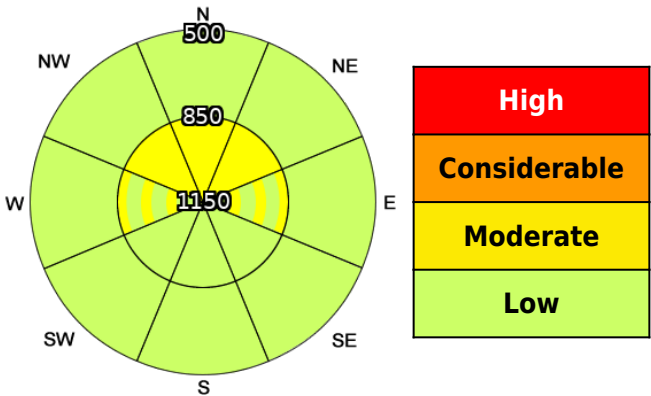

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Overnight, the snowpack will continue to thaw and diminish as heavy rain affects the area. During the day the old wet snowpack will consolidate as the freezing level lowers. New snow will develop accumulations of windslab in sheltered locations the greatest deposits will be on North-West to North-East aspects mainly above 850 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight, heavy rain at all levels with storm force South-South-Easterly winds, the freezing level will be well above the summits. During the day the freezing level will lower to around 1000 metres and precipitation will ease. New snow is expect in the afternoon above 600 metres on strong Southerly winds.

Comments

A wild night is forecast. New snow amounts are not expected to be significant.
