
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The old snowpack will become firm and stable. Localised accumulations of windslab will develop through the day on North-West to North-Easterly aspects above 900 metres. Corrie rims and gully tops will be mostly affected. Pockets of cross loaded windslab will also form in other lee areas. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

A dry night with South-Westerly winds decreasing to moderate. During the day light snow showers above 600 metres on increasing strong to gale force Southerly winds, some heavier showers later in the day above 300 metres. The freezing level will lower to 600 metres.

Comments

Main hazards today are strong winds, rivers in full spate and the potential for landslides.
